The Essential iPad Tips and iPad Tricks

Hi-tech electronic products (especially all-in-one consumer electronics) are very popular now and Apple is generally popular. iPad essentially revolutionises the concept of a tablet computer. Easy/Quick Mute

Unlike the iPhone, there's no dedicated mute switch on the iPad.

Apple decided to make the volume buttons do double duty. Tap them repeatedly and the volume will go up or down. But if you press and hold the volume down button for about two seconds, then you get a quick mute.

Download podcasts

You can search for and subscribe to podcasts so they are downloaded automatically to your iPad. Go to iTunes, then click Podcasts at the bottom of the screen. Search for the one you want and select it, then select Free next to the episodes you want. Note: to subscribe to podcasts, you need to use a PC and sync with the iPad. When you press the power button on the iPad it really just turns off the screen. That's why it comes on so fast. What you may want to do to conserve battery life or recover from a freeze is do a reboot.

To do this just hold down both the power button and Home button until the red slider

appears on the screen. Slide it and the iPad will shut down. Give it a minute and then you can restart it by pressing the power button again. It seems to take a few seconds before it responds so be patient. And, to force quit an application, just hold the home button by itself in a similar fashion.

Type fast

The soft keyboard on the iPad does not work like the inaccurate keypads on a smartphone. You may be tempted to

type slow and methodically, but no worries: you can actually type your normal speed and the iPad, using its Apple A4 processor, keeps up rather nicely.

Turn off email alert chimes

Are you a very popular person? Are you a member to a lot of websites and get tons of emails daily? If so, depending on your tolerance level for distractions, you may want to turn off the email alert chimes on your iPad. Sure, they are a great way to notify yourself of when a new email pops in, especially if you were waiting on one from a special someone, but they can get annoying. To disable the email chimes, go to Settings>General>Sounds. Once there, you can turn the chimes off. If they are not that distracting to you, but a little on the loud side, you can also adjust their volume by following the same steps.

Take an iPad screenshot

Like the iPhone, you can take a screenshot by pressing Home and then the power button. Images are saved automatically in the Photos gallery. Here, you can view or email them.

Copy and Paste Text from One App to Another

Just tap and hold a word, then use your finger to drag to select more text, and then Copy it. Go to the other application, tap and hold in the input box, and then use Paste. Easy!

Want to select a whole paragraph the easy way? Just tap it 4 times to highlight the entire paragraph, then use Copy.

Preview more of your emails

The iPad's Mail app defaults to previewing two lines of each email before you click on it. Sometimes however it would be handier to be able to see more of an email before loading the whole thing in, especially if you are on a slow connection. To do this open the Settings app, then click on Mail, Contacts, Calendars and change the Preview options to add more lines.

As
you know, Apple's iPad looks and behaves like a scaled-up version

of an iPod Touch or iPhone, but there are some key differences that distinguish the iPad from its pocket-size comrades. One of these differences, surprisingly, is music playback.

Music

on the iPad feels more like iTunes than the iPod or iPhone.

Clicking

on the iPod icon sitting in the virtual tray at the bottom of the iPad opens up a music browser that looks nothing like any previous generation of iPod or iPhone, but instead, works like a stripped-down version of Apple's iTunes music software.

There's

the familiar iTunes grey bar running across the top, with playback controls, a volume slider, a search box and the little progress/scrubber bar. Playlists are perpetually pinned to a sidebar, along with icons for audio books, music, music videos and podcasts. Across the bottom you'll find buttons for creating genius playlists or standard playlists, along with tabs to sort your music by songs, artists, albums, genres or composers. Pressing on the cover art in the bottom left corner will expand the artwork to full screen.

But

in spite of how much the iPad's music browser looks and acts like iTunes, it's really a bit of a hybrid between the iTunes interface and the capabilities of the iPod's browser. For better or worse, there are no extensive preferences to tweak, no sorting options beyond the previously mentioned tabs, no importing of audio beyond over-the-air purchases and media transferred from your computer and no smart playlists.

But one of the failures of iTunes is the inability to copy iPad music to iTunes library without the third party utilities. But there are many people who ask how to do it. Here we recommend the world's best iPad to Mac transfer software. With its friendly interface, even a novice can use it.

WAV, or Apple Lossless Encoder formats. The music will then be stored on your hard drive for access anytime.

Convert

music to a different format: After you have imported your music files into iTunes, you can convert them to a different format (e.g., MP3 to AAC or WAV to MP3).

Listen

to and view podcasts: Through the iTunes Store, you can search for and subscribe to podcasts. Whenever you open iTunes, the latest episodes of these free audio and video programs will download automatically to your iTunes Library.

Buy

music and videos online: Through the iTunes Store, you can purchase music, audiobooks, movies, and episodes of television shows. If you want to put your favorite ipod songs to itunes, the guide on how to put songs from ipod to itunes can help you a lot.

Export

to a non-Apple MP3 player: You can export your playlists to a non-Apple commercial MP3 player through USB or USB 2.0. To upload files, drag them to the MP3 player icon.

Buy

iPhone, iPod touch, and iPad apps online: Through the iTunes App Store, you can purchase applications for your iPhone, iPod touch, or iPad.

Create

playlists: Once you have stored your music on your hard drive, you can play it in any order you like by creating a playlist. You can organize your music according to artist, album, or song title as well.

Synchronize

with your iPod, iPhone, or iPad: When you plug in your iPod, iPhone, or iPad, iTunes will synchronize automatically at high speeds over FireWire or USB 2.0.

Listen

to Internet radio: iTunes features a built-in Internet radio tuner that will find Internet radio stations by genre.

Play

movie trailers: You can view movie trailers available on Apple's web site. To do so, search the iTunes Music Store from within iTunes, or visit iTunes Movie Trailers. If you are also a film fan like me, that would be great.

Listen

to music shared across the network: You can choose to make your Library available to other iTunes users on your local network, and you can likewise access others' iTunes playlists. The available playlists appear in iTunes automatically.

Visualize

your music: iTunes includes a music visualizer that plays a light show along with the music.

And

another is iTunes Playlists. Well, how to Make a Custom Playlist Using iTunes. A playlist is a custom list of music tracks that is made up from songs in your music library; you can think of playlists as your own music compilations. You can make as many playlists as you want and give them any name you desire. It is sometimes useful to organize tracks into playlists to suit a particular musical style or mood. This tutorial will show you how

to generate a playlist from a selection of songs from the music library folder.

If

you haven't got any music in your iTunes library yet then the quickest way is to import your CDs (see the tutorial on CD ripping). The article on the dos and don'ts of CD copying and ripping is also a useful resource to read. If you have got many songs in your iPhone, I think

move

playlist from iPhone to iTunes is a good choice for you.

If

you need to install iTunes first on your Mac or PC, then the best place to get the latest version is to download it from Apple's web site.

And

now, iTunes still growing faster than peers at 7 years old. It was not hard to see that iTunes was not only growing quickly even over seven years but faster than some longstanding platforms. At 225 million accounts, it was still growing at a logarithmic scale, Asymco saw. The Xbox 360, Windows Mobile, and Symbian had tapered off either at the same seven-year mark or earlier.
